BIBLE GEOGRAPHY

Class Description:

Come study the geography of the Holy Lands together. We will touch on all aspects of geography, travel with Biblical characters, examine Biblical events while observing the geography surrounding those people and events, gain a greater understanding of how geography impacted the people and events of the Bible, and how geography can impact your life today. There will be weekly questions that walk you through familiar and not so familiar Bible stories, followed by mapping exercises to make the Bible come to life. This class will be presented in a “facilitated Bible study” format. Each person will do their own weekly assignment at home and then we will come together as a group and discuss answers and compare maps. Although I anticipate 1-2 hours of homework per week, this course would lend itself nicely to a high school student wanting to earn a full credit by exploring additional topics included in the student notebook and writing papers and/or making presentations to the class. It's also great for a mom to learn here and then teach the material to her students at home!

NOTE: This is a 2 hour class for the price of one hour! There is so much fun stuff to cover that we will enjoy the study much more with extra time to devote to the lesson. The lessons will be as rich and diverse as the students attending.

The information you learn will be as varied as the class members and the information they share!
